CITY OF ROSEBURG LIBRARY COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES February 15, 2022

CALL TO ORDER:

Chair Andrea Zielinski called the regular meeting of the Roseburg Library Commission to order at 4:01 p.m. on February 15, 2022, electronically via Zoom in Roseburg, Oregon.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Commissioner Tassano moved to approve the January 18, 2022, minutes. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Guyer and approved with the following vote: Chair Zielinski and Commissioners Elder, Tassano, Lundy, Guyer and Peter voted yes. No one voted no.

BUSINESS FROM THE COMMISSION:

Commissioner Tassano announced the Friends of Library spring book sale will be held Thursday, March 3 through Saturday, March 5, 2022. She added this will be a bargain book sale. Books are lower quality; however, each book is fully examined and in one piece.

INFORMATIONAL:

Strategic Plan Report

Director Wiley presented an overview of the first year of the library's five-year strategic plan. She noted progress toward the four goals set in the plan, specifically related to posts on social media and News-Review articles that highlight the collection and outreach initiatives that were increased after receiving the Oregon Community Foundation's K-12 Summer Learning grant.

Director Wiley noted some adjustments staff made over the past year. The basic computer classes for adults are ready to go when the library returns to in-person programs. Work with the Cow Creek Band of Umpqua Tribe of Indians has focused on delivering craft kits for youth. Staff has inquired about how to help recognize their celebration of 40 years of tribal recognition. The collection policy was updated last year to include electronic resources; the policy will be reviewed annually at a Library Commission meeting.

Finally, Director Wiley highlighted some activities planned for 2022 that further the goals in the strategic plan, including hosting a bilingual Spanish-English children's program at the Parks and Recreation Department's Movie in the Park in June. In addition, Librarian Ropp will add a Spanish-English storywalk in the park, and staff will continue to communicate with community partners about ways to collaborate.

Monthly Statistics

Director Wiley presented the monthly statistics and noted that the numbers have remained fairly consistent from month to month. The circulation snapshot on February 1 indicated 4.9 percent of the collection was checked out. Before the pandemic, we were closer to 8 percent.

The library has issued 42 library card sponsorships this fiscal year. A donation of \$5,000 was received from Jane Ratzlaff to continue the program. Ms. Ratzlaff's donation in 2018 has provided the bulk of the financial support for the program. Director Wiley stated she plans to write a News-Review article about the program and ask for community donations. In response to Chair Zielinski, Director Wiley explained that library cards expire yearly; this is common among libraries.

Programming

Ms. Rathe reported the Rajneesh program, hosted by Les Zaitz, had a great turnout with 33 live views and 95 additional views after the live event ended. The author discussion with Michael Baughman was canceled.

Upcoming programming includes a discussion with Kirk Blaine from the Native Fish Society, a presentation on the history of Umpqua Dairy, and a sustainability program.

Ms. Rathe stated she has started to work on fall programming. The library will host a presentation by Oregon author Sierra Crane Murdoch, a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize for her novel "Yellow Bird." Additional author presentations and a program on foraging are in the works. Director Wiley commended Ms. Rathe for her hard work and determination in getting programs scheduled.

Director Wiley reported 16 people read 133 books for the Winter Reading Program for adults. This is about the same level of participation as the Summer Reading Program. The group discussed ideas for additional incentives to increase participation.

Librarian Ropp reported 46 children submitted 220 individual book reviews for the Winter Reading Program for youth. This was an increase in participation from the program last year.

Librarian Ropp reported online storytimes continue weekly. She continues to work on plans for the Summer Reading Program. Plans include at least one live performance, storytimes in the park, and more. Staff continues to deliver craft kits to the Boys and Girls Club and the YMCA. She added that it was Altrusa Celebration of Literacy day, and children could receive a free book from the library.

Staffing Update

Director Wiley reported that Kesna Wells will start as a part-time Library Aide this week. Ms. Wells has library experience, including experience with our library software program. The library now is fully staffed.

Director Wiley reported the City of Roseburg will apply for another United Communities AmeriCorps participant for the 2022-23 service term. Chair Zielinski stated she is excited to see the program continue to be successful.

Grants Update

Director Wiley reported the library received a \$30,000 grant from the Douglas County Library Foundation for collection materials and a \$1,000 grant from the Douglas County Cultural Coalition for the Summer Reading Program.

The library was awarded \$10,000 from the American Library Association and National Endowment for the Humanities through the American Rescue Plan: Humanities Grants for Libraries. The library will host a three-part series focused on Chicanx literature with project scholar Dr. Alma Rosa Alvarez, Professor of English at Southern Oregon University. Each 90-minute session will focus on one book and additional reading material. Dr. Alvarez will deliver a mini-lecture to contextualize the content, and she will facilitate class discussion. The goal is to use literature to help participants learn about the Mexican American experience in order to create community. The sessions are scheduled for the first Thursday in June, July and August 2022. Director Wiley stated she will write a News-Review article announcing the project, and Ms. Rathe will manage the project details. The series will be free and open to the public with all three sessions on Zoom.

The Friends of the Library received a third year of support from Umpqua Health Alliance for Dolly Parton's Imagination Library. The grant is \$5,000.

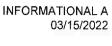

Number of cards issued FY 2021-2022 – 54

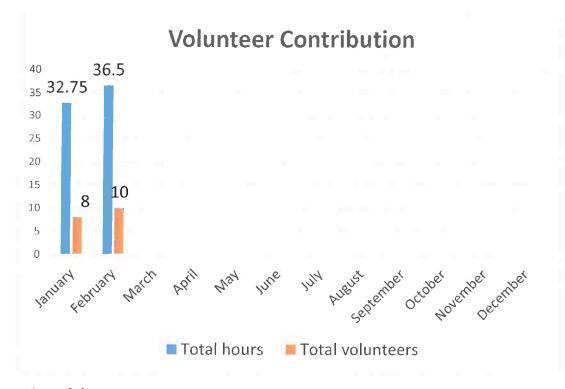


Total value added to collection February 2022 - \$7819.96
